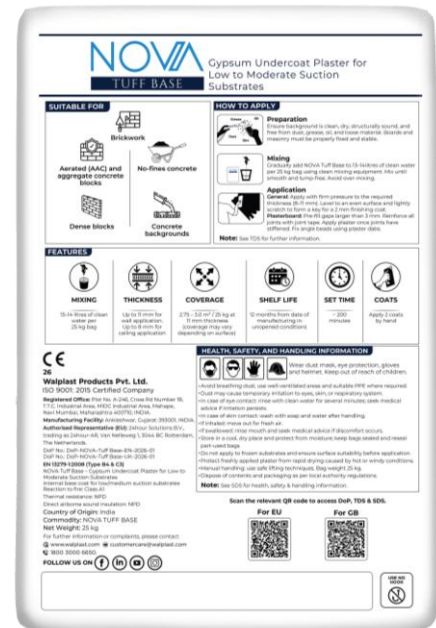

SECTION 4: First aid measures.

4.1 Description of first aid measures:

Inhalation:

- Move to fresh air
- Rinse mouth and gently clear nasal passages if necessary
- Seek medical attention if symptoms persist

Skin contact:

- Wash with soap and warm water
- Apply moisturizer if dryness occurs

Eye contact:

- Rinse cautiously with clean water for at least 15 minutes

- Dry or cracked skin
- Coughing from dust exposure
- Wet plasters may cause mild local irritation

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures.

- Non-flammable, non-combustible mineral-based material
- No specific extinguishing media required; use media appropriate for surrounding fire

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

- Avoid creating or inhaling airborne dust
- Wear appropriate PPE such as FFP2 respirator, gloves, and safety goggles where dust exposure is likely

6.2 Environmental precautions:	Prevent material from entering drains or water courses, as it may solidify and cause blockages
6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up:	- Sweep or vacuum using low-dust methods (avoid dust generation) - Do not wash into drains (sets solid) - Dispose of collected material in accordance with local UK waste regulations

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:	- Provide adequate local ventilation during mixing - Avoid breathing dust - Use appropriate PPE - Avoid contact with moisture prior to use
7.2 Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities:	- Store in a cool, dry indoor area - Keep bags tightly sealed until use - Protect from ground moisture and damp conditions - Avoid excessive stacking to prevent bag deformation - Shelf life: 12 months (if stored correctly)
